Becoming a member

- Please consider visiting the park 1-2 times before becoming a member to make sure it is fun for both you and your dog.
- Annual membership fee for joining the park is \$25 for Kingston residents and \$30 for non-residents.
 - Up to 3 dogs may be registered per family.
 - \$5 additional fee for each dog after first dog is registered
- Fees are needed to maintain the park grounds as well as covering day-to-day expenses.
- Registration forms are to the left of the entrance gate or in the large tote just inside the park. They may also be downloaded and printed from the website www.kingstondogpark.com.
- Please bring the completed form to the park and ask if a board member is there (we would like to meet you and your dogs in person).
- If a board member is present, they will give you a tag immediately.
- If a board member is not present, please place your form and payment in the red box under the shelter. Registration tag(s) will be mailed to you within two weeks.

Park Rules

Here at the park we are all volunteers and each of us must help to keep the park as a safe, well maintained space. All registered park members are asked to assist in enforcing these rules.

- Hours of Operation: Dawn through dusk
- All children must be supervised by an adult (No children under 12 years old)
- No dog or human food allowed in park
- Pick up after your dog
- No aggressive dogs
- Monitor dogs for inappropriate behavior
- No dogs in heat allowed/Closely monitor unneutered dogs
- Dogs must not have transferable health conditions
- Dogs must have a current town license, rabies vaccine, and park registration tag visible.
- Police must be notified if a dog draws blood from a person
- Dispose of all wastes in proper receptacles
- Cigarette butts are harmful to dogs. Please dispose of it in the black butt box.

Park Etiquette

A few tips to get you started!

- Always pick up after your dog poops.
- Poop bags are located around the park fence and poop buckets are at the entrance.
- If you see a dog pooping, please alert the owner if they are unaware.
- Regular trash goes in large gray buckets. Please empty drink containers before placing them in the trash.
- If your dog is bothering another dog, please attend to the situation. Get up and go over to the dog and intervene.
- Keep your dog away from the entrance when a new dog arrives, to make sure the new dog is not intimidated.
- If you see another person who is not attentive to their dog's behavior, please speak to them. We are all volunteers; do not rely on someone else to do the right thing.
- There is a smaller dog area at the double entrance, for dogs who need a time out or dogs who need a gentle introduction to the park.
